Supporting our communities during this time of mourning

There have been many ways in which you have expressed care and service over these past days, in offering worship for reflection and remembrance; opening churches for prayer, the lighting of candles and provision of books of condolence; in comforting those who grieve. **Thank you!** It is at moments like this that the country looks for beacons of light, and our faith in Christ inspires such hope. Her late Majesty was someone who really lived her faith fully and it has been inspiring to see how that faith has become a talking point across much of the media. How we live and tell the story of God's love for the world authentically at this moment will be significant.

The protocols in relation to this time of mourning have already been forwarded to clergy and parishes. Do <u>visit the Church of England website for the latest guidance and resources.</u> We now know the funeral will take place on **Monday 19**th **September at 11am**. It is a national holiday and many will therefore be able to gather to watch the TV coverage. Some churches intend to stream it live so that people can come together rather than watch alone. There is <u>no requirement for a special licence</u> for such an event.

On the afternoon and evening before the funeral, churches are being encouraged to hold services of reflection and requiem. Some of you have already notified us of your plans and timings. Please do publicise these widely across different media so that as many members of the public as possible can attend. We also now know of the national plan for a minute's silence at 8pm on Sunday evening. This may be an opportunity for local vigils to be held in community spaces. We want to encourage you to make plans that work best with both national expectation and your own local context. You hold the expertise for what will work best where you are. We know that you will do that well.

Responding to the cost of living crisis

Meanwhile the cost of living crisis continues to cause concern both in personal financial challenges in relation to fuel and food, and the increasing expense required in maintaining our local churches.

This winter will bring some huge challenges for people within our communities. Some will be faced with a choice between eating and heating. Our food banks are already experiencing high demand and some of our churches are offering regular weekly meals for children, families and the most vulnerable.

Some of you are now beginning to consider how you might also provide warm spaces for people within your churches and halls, where people can spend time comfortably. Thank you for all the creative thought and care you are putting into such plans. We know this will be costly both in terms of time and indeed in energy bills. The new Government last week shared its energy plan to support households over the next two years and we understand there will be some equivalent help for businesses and charities including churches, promised for six months. Our Buildings Adviser, Emma Brown, has given some assistance in addressing the issues, questions and concerns you may have in a helpful guide available on the diocesan website, along with a link to the Warm Welcome website.

The impact of the cost of living crisis on our churches and diocese

We are all facing financial challenges at this time, and in coming together we can support one another through it. Together we can help each other understand the challenges we face, both individually and collectively, and seek ways forward.
